- e) All candidates for executive elections were introduced. Nominations closed Thursday at 3:30pm. Five positions on the Executive Council are open to election including President, Official's Rep, Section I, Section 3 and Regina. Voting will occur by secret ballot Friday morning.
- f) President's Address

Welcome all of you to our 2006 AGM in Estevan. A special welcome to first time attendees at this meeting and I hope you are inspired to return again and again to be involved in the development of high school sport in Saskatchewan.

I would like to extend a big thank you to Estevan and the South East District for all their hard work in hosting. We look forward to all you have to offer during our time here.

Our meeting this year is charged with reshaping educational athletics in Saskatchewan. The groundwork has been done to enable a

smooth transition to fit our new district model. With the combined efforts of our District Presidents, their new executives and individuals involved in delivery of programs, I know we will be offering a sound, quality program in the new school year.

Our office staff and executive have invested a great deal of energy this year. It has been an exciting year. Their commitment and dedication to high school sport makes me proud to be involved with them. At regular meetings, at provincial championships, at home in the areas they represent, they consistently provide effort and leadership to help quality programs grow. The involvement of our students is the driving force. I thank our office staff and executive for their enthusiasm for high school sport. They are a very special group of people.

Guiding Principles for Provincial Championships is one document the executive was charged with developing by last year's AGM. Our executive directors and executive spent considerable time formulating the philosophies found within this paper. Take the time to carefully study this work.

I want to thank all of you who give so selflessly of yourselves for educational athletics. It is often frustrating that the public perceives it is part of our job to do this voluntary work. The educational benefits to the students of our province who are involved as organizers and as athletes are enormous. As everyone involved in education does not recognize these values, we must continue to illustrate and promote our successes. These successes are the development of life skills and citizenship. The practices and games, the wins and losses, the medals won or lost are but the road followed to achieve these lessons.

h) Executive Director's Report

Welcome to the 58th annual general meeting of the SHSAA. Once again we have a large delegation, 166 people have taken the time and made the effort to be here, to participate in the affairs of the Association. South East District is proving to be an outstanding host and for me personally it is great to be back in my hometown. I want to take this opportunity to acknowledge the work of the South East committee headed up by Dan Betnar from Estevan Comprehensive School.

2005 – 2006 has been another successful year for the Association. Fiscally we have exceeded our goals and competitively we have experienced some of our finest playoffs and championship events. This is due to the efforts of our host schools and the teachers and students that use the hosting opportunities presented to them to showcase their schools and communities. I want to single out Moose Jaw. This year Moose Jaw successfully hosted our two largest events, hoopla and track, as well as, 5A boys volleyball and the

Canadian School Sport Federation annual meeting.

This year has been a great challenge for those involved in the organization and administration of our district associations. Change is not easy and often frustration becomes the motivation that moves us forward to seek the best for our athletic programs. From visiting your districts, attending your planning meetings and talking with you via telephone. I know the amount of time and effort you have put in as volunteers to ensure interschool athletic opportunities continue to be a valued and integral part of our education system. Boards of education and more importantly the students in our schools will be appreciative of your efforts.

As an Association we still have a number of challenges ahead. This year for the first time in years we have noticed a decline in the number of students and teams involved in SHSAA activities. In the recent past, even with declining enrolments and school closures we have experienced increases, if not a stable number, of students and teams involved in our programs. We need to monitor this and look at the reasons why this may be occurring. I believe the opportunities in some schools are reduced due to a lack of human and financial resources available to ensure a program of multi-sport opportunities, a combination of team and individual activities for students.

We are experiencing the changing of the guard in most districts. New faces are present at all meetings. I think it is right to challenge the veterans to mentor these young people and convince these newcomers of the importance and rewards to be achieved by taking an active role in interschool sport, just as our mentors did for each of us when we broke into the teaching profession.

I believe, as many of you sense, there will be a number of school closures in the near future. The changes we are currently undertaking are a start to more adjustments that will be necessary to assure a meaningful and manageable program of interschool athletic competition that will be a source of pride for schools and communities.

Even though this is a time of many changes within education and for educational athletics, I feel we must also be aware of the historical significance of our Association and in particular the District Associations. As we plan for fourteen district associations next year I want to remind you of the historical significance of the former district names. The districts were named for their geographical position within the province for a purpose, that being immediate identification of a school or team as the representative of an area of the province at our provincial championships. Most, if not all districts were created in the late 1940's with these descriptive names that hold historical significance for former student athletes as they have been recorded in record books and halls of fame within and outside of our province. I believe in most cases these descriptive names are

still viable. The new districts have been defined by the boundaries of the new public school divisions, but the new districts are made up of more schools than those under the direction of the large public school division. Even though we have used those public school divisions to define the new areas, I believe the districts deserve a descriptive name that signals their position in the province and respects the history of interschool sport for the past 58 years. Soon as the school representatives that make up the district association make those decisions we look forward to recognizing your district name rather than referring to you as district 1, district 2 or district 14.

The Executive Council has worked on two issues this year. Guiding principles for decision making regarding playoffs leading to the provincial championships and a playoff plan for the future that will encourage schools to be involved at every stage of their schools athletic program development. Once these are resolved I trust we will be directed by the provincial council to address other issues that still affect the effectiveness of our Association. Things like classification, seasons of play, number of contests during the year and traditional activities vs. new or added activities wishing access to the SHSAA calendar of events.

School Sport Week will be celebrated in our province again this fall, as well as, across Canada. This celebration of school sport will take place for eight days, October 14th to the 21st. Please

watch for the posters and an instruction package coming to your school this fall.

I must remind you of the need to get on-line to the SHSAA exnet database and update the school information listed for your school. Virtually every school has a new e-mail address; new school division name and some of you have personnel changes. Please update this information before you leave in June. The information recorded there will be published in the new handbook and directory and distributed to all schools in the fall.

As Wade mentioned in his address I have agreed to an extension of my contract for two additional years. I was flattered at the offer to continue. It is because of the people involved in our organization and the passion exhibited for school sport and for coaching that made my decision to remain an easy one. The Executive Council you have put in place to manage the affairs of the Association truly represent that passion and hard work. The staff, Kevin Vollet, Jessica Blair and soon to return Kim Platt, share that passion and pride in being involved. On their behalf and mine, thank you for the opportunity to serve the SHSAA and I thank Kevin and Jessica for another successful year in the office.
