Executive Director's Report

On behalf of the Executive Council and the SHSAA office, season's greetings to you and your families. The Association hopes that each of you were able to spend some quality time with loved ones and rejuvenate for the upcoming second half of the 2009-2010 school year.

The Christmas break brings closure to the fall activities. This year's fall program of championships was again a success due in large part to the many individuals involved with interschool sport. Thank you for all you provide to the students of our province. Preparation for the winter and spring championships is now in the works and included in this newsletter is the necessary information needed for these upcoming activities. This information will also be posted on the web site with all updates posted periodically. This is where the most current updates will be posted. Please remind all individuals in your school involved with the winter and spring activities to visit the SHSAA web site on a consistent basis so as to be informed of the current updates. The office will also inform all District Presidents and Athletic Commissioners via email the day of the update so that these individuals will be able to serve in the capacity of reminding their own schools which will facilitate the communication process.

The fall season of SHSAA activities experienced a few bumps along the way. As many of you know, the community of Wynyard suffered a loss of one of their students due to a health issue. This was at the start of the H1N1 situation in the province and thus in cooperation with the Horizon School Division, the Provincial Cross Country Championship was relocated to Regina. Thank you to Mr. Marc Danylchuk for his role in supporting the process and to Regina District, in particular Greg Johnson, for accommodating the province in a matter of days. Thank you to Glenis Klebeck and Lou-anne Stefankiw for the time spent preparing for the fall championship. A big thank you also goes to the many coaches and supervisors from every district that volunteered the day of the meet so the students were able to participate in this year's championship. Thank you to all schools that implemented the precautionary protocols for the students of their schools during the fall sports. With immunization now complete for those individuals choosing to be inoculated, the SHSAA activities will return to the customary congratulatory and sportsmanship gestures of shaking hands before and after any contest. Some school divisions have retained more stringent protocols for their school teams, therefore these teams should make their opponent aware of such practices.

There are two championships that remain open for the fall of 2010 following the District President's meeting. These will require written bids to be submitted to the SHSAA Executive Council on or before March 27th, 2010. The two open championships are 2A Boys Soccer and 5A Girls Volleyball. Please refer to the SHSAA Handbook (pg. 68) for the criteria required in a written bid. The Executive will select the host site of these championships at their April meeting.

SHSAA curling championships will consist of 16 teams competing in a triple-knockout competition with the final four qualifiers taking part in a championship round to determine the medal places. Information about the host centers and competing teams are printed below, including their position on the draw. To complete the 16 teams for the draw a second representative team is chosen from the previous year's championship district. A random draw, held in the SHSAA office, determines the placing in the draw (Except districts with two representatives, one representative is placed in the top half and the other rep in the bottom half). Once a school qualifies, you must contact the provincial commissioner and SHSAA office. **Please NOTIFY the PROVINCIAL commissioner and the SHSAA office by noon Monday, March 1, 2010 or earlier.**

SHSAA BASKETBALL PLAYOFFS

CONFERENCE

1A – 4A Classifications:

- All registered basketball teams have been placed in a geographical conference.
 - if your school is not listed and your school plans on having a team, you must contact the SHSAA office
 - if your school is listed and your school will not be forming a team or you do not wish to enter the provincial playoff, you must contact the SHSAA office by February 3, 2010
- The teams designated to each particular conference are listed in this document and updated on the SHSAA website.
- The SHSAA office will seed each conference tournament.
- Draws for the conference tournaments will be found in the RESULTS section http://www.shsaa.ca/pages/ets/pub_standings.php?p_district_id=14 on the SHSAA website on or before March 1, 2010
- Each coach is to fill out and submit a seeding form including their opinion on the seeding of their conference and the province. Seeding forms are due on or before February 26, 2010.
- Districts are to notify the SHSAA office of host sites for the conference tournaments they have been assigned. Please check the website periodically to see updates to conferences, including host sites.

Conference Tournaments:

- All conference tournaments will be played the weekend of March 5 & 6, 2010
- As per the resolution passed at the 2008 AGM there will not be a consolation side included in the tournaments. In conferences of five or six teams that are designated to advance more than two teams there will be a qualifier bracket to advance the extra teams to regional play.
- The draw templates for the conference tournaments can be found on the SHSAA website.

REGIONAL

1A – 4A Classifications:

- Teams will advance from conference play to regional play, **except** in 4A Girls where there will be single elimination games played. The 16 teams that advance to regional play will be seeded 1 to 16 and will be placed in one of four regional tournaments in their classification.
- Each regional tournament will include a championship and consolation side with the winner of the championship side advancing to HOOPLA.
- Regional tournament hosts will be named on March 8, 2010.
- Regional tournaments will be played the weekend of March 12 & 13, 2010.
- Each District Officials' Commissioners should prepare to host a minimum of 2 and possibly more Regional Tournaments in their district.
- Schools interested in hosting a regional basketball playoff are invited to submit a bid to host on or before January 31st. Send bids to the SHSAA office.

HOOPLA

- HOOPLA will be hosted in Saskatoon on March 18 – 20, 2010.
- **1A – 4A classifications:** The four regional champions will play a straight elimination four team tournament with a consolation side to determine third place.
- **5A classification:** There will be an eight team tournament composed of four teams from Regina and four teams from Saskatoon. The tournament will have a championship and consolation side.

SEEDING OF TEAMS FOR CONFERENCE AND REGIONAL PLAYOFFS

Seeding forms are due into the SHSAA office on or before February 26, 2010.

Cooperation and input from all coaches is requested to assist in seeding the basketball playoffs.

- The SHSAA office requires written confirmation of season results from **ALL BASKETBALL TEAMS**. Include results of all games played (tournament, league, and exhibition) including who your opponents were and the result, win or loss.
- Please include your opinion regarding the seeding of the teams in your conference as well as your opinion regarding the top 8 teams in the province in your classification. Submit the form to the SHSAA office by **Friday, February 26, 2010.**

ENTRY:

1. All wrestlers from registered schools outside Regina and Saskatoon **MUST** attend this meet in order to qualify for the Provincial Tournament.
2. Registered schools may enter more than one wrestler per division.
3. Every participating school **MUST** contact the commissioner, with their intent to enter, and indicate the number of competitors by the Monday preceding the regional tournament. Competitors who have not been pre-registered by their coaches will not be allowed to participate in the tournament.
4. **This will be a one-day meet.** Weigh-in will be done by fax and Wrestling will begin at 10:00 a.m.
5. The Saskatchewan District team that advances to the Provincial Tournament will consist of up to four qualifiers from this meet per weight division.
6. The coaches present will select the "District" coaching staff. (Head and Assistant Coach.)
7. The District Coaches in consultation with the commissioner will select the final district team.

WEIGH-IN:

A weigh-in will not be held at the Regional tournament. **Each wrestler must weigh in at their home school. A school administrator or their designate must certify the weight. Certified weights must be faxed to the host commissioner by 12:00 p.m. the Thursday preceding the meet (March 4, 2010).** Note this procedure is used for the regional meet only.

SKIN INSPECTIONS: Skin inspections will begin at 9:00 am. All participants must pass the on-site skin inspection before wrestling.

START TIME:

The tournament begins at 10:00 am. Three wrestling mats are available for matches.

SKIN CHECKS:

Skin examinations will begin at 11:30 a.m. at the site. All wrestlers must clear skin inspection prior to reporting for weigh-in.

WEIGH-IN:

Weigh in will take place at the site from 12:00 noon to 1:00 p.m. Friday, March 12th. Wrestlers must weigh in at this time and make the weight class that they qualified for at the Provincial.

WEIGH-IN PROCEDURE:

Scales for the weigh-ins will be available as a "check" for wrestlers between 11:00 am and 11:30 am.

COMPETITION:

Wrestling will begin at 4:00 p.m. Friday and continue until 9:00 p.m. Wrestling will resume Saturday at 9:00 a.m. and will continue to completion of the preliminary round. (Approx. 12:00 p.m.). The medal rounds should commence approximately one and a half hours after the completion of the preliminary round.

Former Players Great Source for Officials

Officiating associations in all sports and areas of the country are struggling to find enough referees/umpires to officiate all the games. In my seven years of officiating high school sports in three different sports, I have been continually amazed by the lack of ex-players who referee or umpire.

Coaches should use their connections with former players to encourage them to join officiating ranks so that competent officials are available for youth sporting events. And, after coaches hang up their whistles, they should consider becoming a referee as well.

Coaches, no doubt, are aware of the crisis of attracting officials who possess an understanding of the sport in which they work. Who better to do this than former coaches and athletes? Coaches also should be deeply interested in making sure that future athletes in their programs receive the same opportunities that they enjoyed.

There are a variety of benefits from donning the stripes: physical fitness, an opportunity to associate with people who may become lifelong friends, the satisfaction of doing something that not a lot of people can do and of course, the extra money. Some officials save all their officiating income and funnel it into their children's education.

As many adults get older, they search for something that still gives them a "rush". However, in many cases, the body won't allow them to do the things that used to provide that outlet. A beautiful fall night officiating a high school football game, a sunny spring day on the diamond or spending a cold winter night inside running up and down the court with kids provides that kind of "rush" that keeps them sharp.

High school sports officiating associations bend over backwards and provide great support to new people learning to umpire or referee. Countless veterans give their time and knowledge to train the "rookie" officials. If new officials learn to ignore all the fans in the stands, it can be a relaxing hobby and sometimes a perfect tonic for a tough day at their real job. It is an experience that allows for character building, leadership development and the opportunity to learn to remain calm even in the toughest of situations.

The day that officiating seems like a real job is the day to put away the gear and head to the couch. The thrill of a close game, great catch or a perfect curveball is something that is not present in other parts of life. Many people have been in the same occupation for years and, while sometimes financially rewarding, the thrill of something new is gone.

The same reasons that many kids played baseball or basketball from dawn till dusk in the summertime are the same reasons to get involved in officiating. No one ever knows what is going to happen in the field from one moment to the next. While the day job pays the bills, the heart beats much faster with two outs, runner on third and the base runner dancing off third trying to coax the pitcher into balking in the winning run in the bottom of the seventh inning of a 0-0 tie.

While many people have successfully raised families and had careers with financial success, the happiest people are the ones who have a hobby that they love. For some, it is the outdoors with fishing and hunting, others travel. Too many people have spent their entire adult lives working and become miserable in their later years because they don't have a purpose. This void can be filled through high school officiating. High school sports associations can provide names of veteran high school officials who can mentor and teach individuals how to enjoy the avocation of officiating as many of them have for careers that span as long as 40 years in some cases.

Former high school athletes who are attending college can earn a few dollars to help cover the costs of education by officiating in the afternoons/evenings. Most alternatives for extra spending money, such as a working in a restaurant, are no more fun or lucrative than officiating on the field, diamond or court. To the retired or semi-retired person, officiating is a great chance to stay fit, meet some great people and make extra money. Many games around the country are officiated by people from such diverse backgrounds as construction, banking and education. While our society attaches a label to each of the occupations, among the crew, all are equal as they all have a job to do and have to watch each other's backs.

While employers are understandably reluctant to release employees early for games, those in a position to do so sell their employer on the wellness benefits – both physical and mental – and the networking advantages for the company. You might meet your best customer, new supplier, new doctor or future son-in-law in your crew. See you on the field, court or diamond.

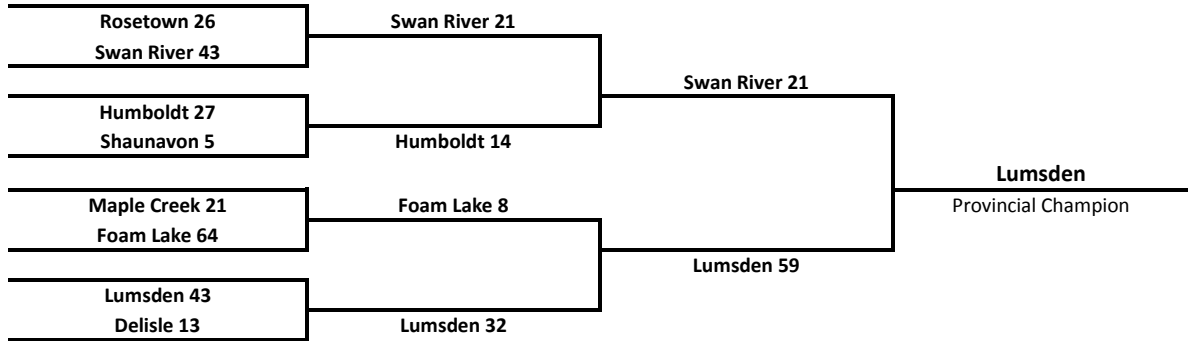

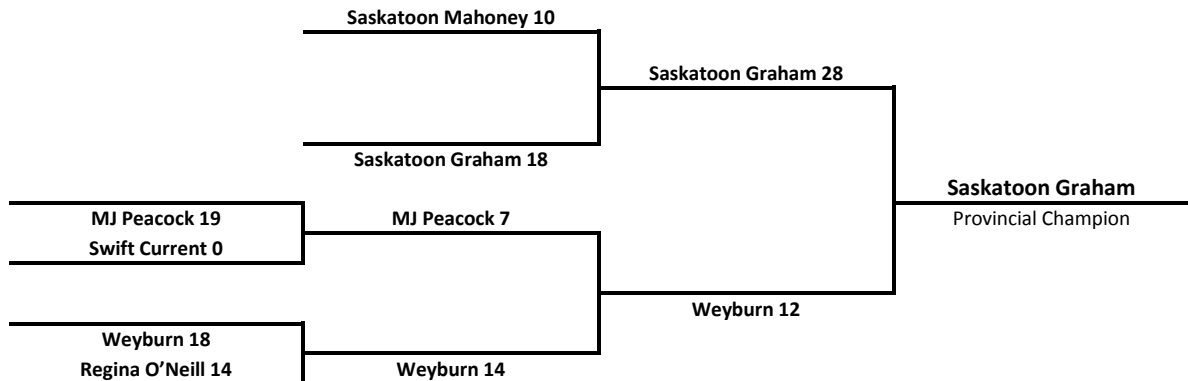

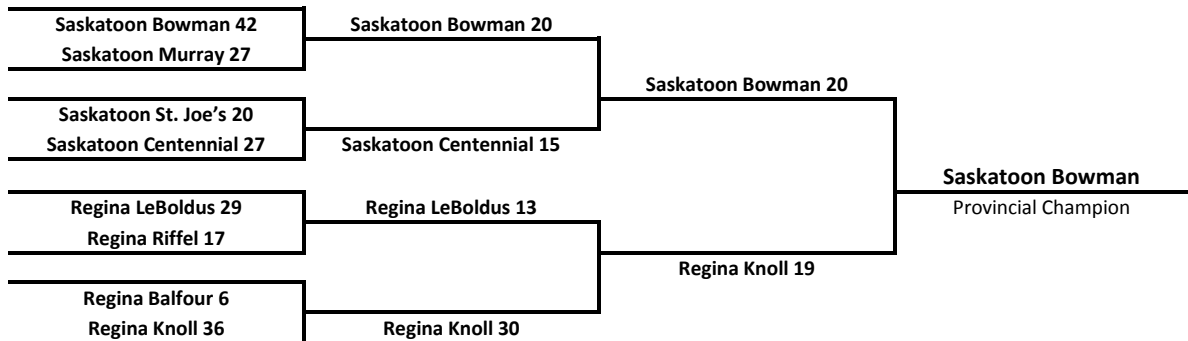
9-Man Provincial Football Playoffs

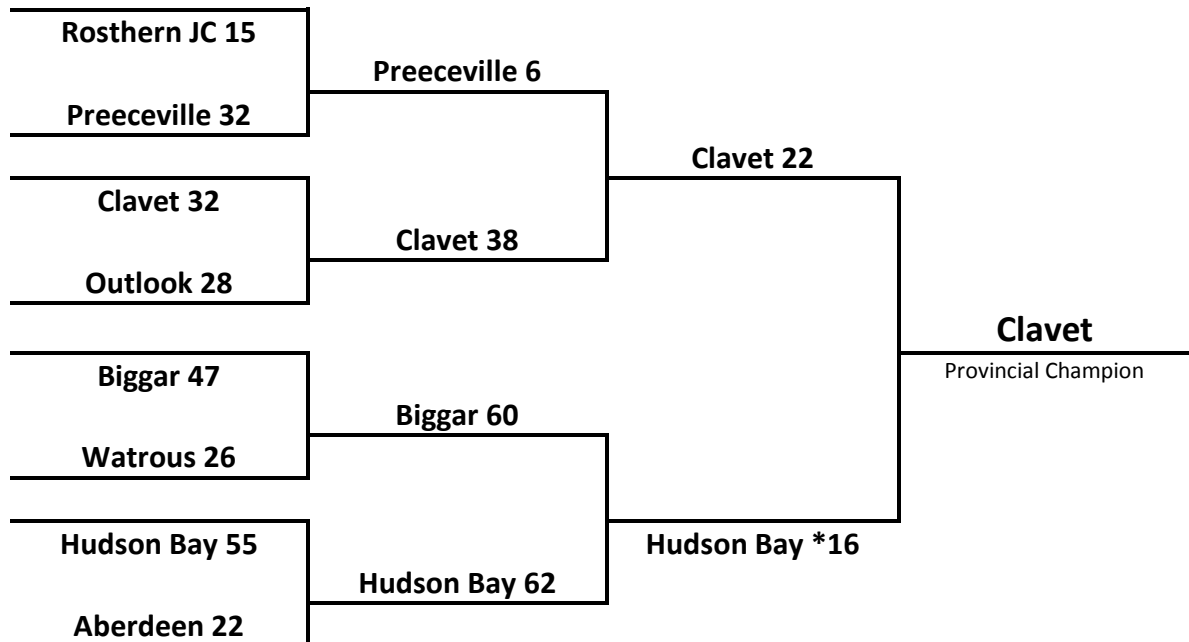
