The second half of the school year is shaping up to be a rewarding experience for all involved in school sport just as the first half. We are looking forward to serving you in any way that is needed and please do not hesitate to call the office anytime.

It goes without saying that the Association wishes to thank each and every one of the schools including the administration, coaches, staff advisors and parent volunteers for providing the opportunities of school sport in your building. A thank you never gets old, and we never get tired of saying it to everyone that offer their time to the students of our province. Our Association held many conference, regional and provincial playoffs throughout the first half of the year all due to the efforts of many schools and their staff. We could not provide these without the cooperation and volunteer hours that your communities provided. A big thank you to the officials that worked for the Association. This newsletter marks the time to prep for the winter and spring championships. All the necessary information is included in this newsletter as well as on the web site. Updates to this information will be posted periodically, so please remind all individuals in your school to visit the SHSAA web site on a consistent basis so as to be informed of the current updates. The office will also inform all District Presidents and Athletic Commissioners via email the day of the update so that these individuals will be able to serve in the capacity of reminding their own schools.

The classification system for the 2012-2013 school year will be based on the Gr. 9-11 enrolment of the current school year as was approved at the 2009 AGM. As such, there have been six championships for the fall of the 2012-2013 that have come open. The six championships that are now open will require written bids to be submitted to the SHSAA Executive Council are 2A Boys Soccer, 3A Girls Soccer, 2A Girls Volleyball, 1A Boys Volleyball, 2A Boys Volleyball and 4A Boys Volleyball. These written bids will be due on or before March 26th, 2012. Please refer to the SHSAA Handbook (pg. 68) for the criteria required in a written bid. The Executive asks that bids be submitted using the form that appears on-line: [SHSAA Bid Form](#). The Executive will select the championship site at their April meeting.

The Executive launched the newest version of the Exnet database early in the fall. This database has provided the Association with a few new features. The public side of the web site is also under a revision. Although taking a bit longer than anticipated, we thank our member schools for their patience in waiting for this newest version. The message board has now returned to the web site with better security features. I invite you to return to this component as it is a key aspect of communication for our schools. A reminder to post tournament results if you host an invitational tournament as this information is vital when it comes to seeding time for basketball. The bi-seasonal ranking will again be conducted this basketball season. Thank you to those that have volunteered to serve as the committee. We encourage all basketball teams to submit their results to the link provided in the coming weeks. The survey will be sent to each team shortly and will have a deadline of Jan. 13, 2012. The first posting will be Jan. 16, 2012. The second posting of the top ten teams in the 1A – 4A categories will be Feb. 13, 2012. These rankings are for interest sake only. A reminder to coaches that the SHSAA seeding form is required by Friday March 2, 2012.

SHSAA PROVINCIAL CURLING CHAMPIONSHIPS

MARCH 2 – 3, 2012

The provincial championship will be held March 2 – 3, 2012 and will consist of 8 teams in a triple knock-out format leading to four qualifiers taking part in a championship round to determine the medallists. The eight teams participating at the provincial championships will include the host school and seven other teams that have qualified through the regional championships.

Regional championships will be held February 17 – 18, 2012. The Regional championships will consist of a six or eight team double knock-out format leading to an 'A' event and 'B' event qualifier to the provincial championship. The only region that may require an A-B playoff to complete the double knock-out competition is the region with the provincial host. The A-B playoff will only be contested if the provincial host has not won either the 'A' or 'B' event. In the regions without an A-B playoff the 'A' event winner will be considered the Regional champion.

A random draw, held in the SHSAA office, will determine the placing of teams in the draw for both the regional and provincial competitions. Teams from the same district/regional will be placed in opposite halves of the draw.

Districts should declare their representatives to the Regional Championships and contact the regional commissioners and SHSAA office by Monday February 13, 2012.

Regional commissioners are asked to contact both the SHSAA office and provincial commissioner by Monday February 21, 2011 with the names of the schools which have advanced to the provincial championship from the Regional Championship they are hosting.

SHSAA BASKETBALL PLAYOFFS

CONFERENCE

1A – 4A Classifications:

- All registered basketball teams have been placed in a geographical conference.
 - if your school is not listed and your school plans on having a team, you must contact the SHSAA office
 - if your school is listed and your school will not be forming a team or you do not wish to enter the provincial playoff, you must contact the SHSAA office by February 8, 2012
- The teams designated to each particular conference are available on the SHSAA website.
- The SHSAA office will seed each conference tournament.
- Draws for the conference tournaments will be found in the RESULTS section, [SHSAA Results](#), on the SHSAA website on or before March 5, 2012
- Each coach is to fill out and submit a seeding form including their opinion on the seeding of their conference and the province. Seeding forms are due on or before March 2, 2012.
- Districts are to notify the SHSAA office of host sites for the conference tournaments they have been assigned. Please check the website periodically to see updates to conferences, including host sites.

Conference Tournaments:

- All conference tournaments will be played the weekend of March 9 – 10, 2012
- As per the resolution passed at the 2008 AGM there will not be a consolation side included in the tournaments. In conferences of four, five, six or seven teams that are designated to advance more than two teams there will be a qualifier bracket to advance the extra teams to regional play.
- The draw templates for the conference tournaments are listed later in this document.

REGIONAL

1A – 4A Classifications:

- Teams will advance from conference play to regional play. The 16 teams that advance to regional play will be seeded 1 to 16 and will be placed in one of four regional tournaments in their classification.
- Each regional tournament will include a championship and consolation side with the winner of the championship side advancing to HOOPLA.
- Regional tournament hosts will be named on March 12, 2012.
- Regional tournaments will be played the weekend of March 16 – 17, 2012.
- Each District Officials' Commissioner should prepare to host a minimum of 2 and possibly more Regional Tournaments in their district.
- Schools interested in hosting a regional basketball playoff are invited to submit a bid to host on or before January 31st. Send bids to the SHSAA office.

HOOPLA

- HOOPLA will be hosted in Regina on March 22 – 24, 2012.
- **1A – 4A classifications:** The four regional champions will play a straight elimination four team tournament with a consolation side to determine third place.
- **5A classification:** There will be an eight team tournament composed of four teams from the Regina District and four teams from the Saskatoon District. The tournament will have a championship and consolation side.

SEEDING OF TEAMS FOR CONFERENCE AND REGIONAL PLAYOFFS

Seeding forms are due to the SHSAA office on or before March 2, 2012.

- The SHSAA office requires written confirmation of season results from **ALL BASKETBALL TEAMS**. Include results of all games played (tournament, league, and exhibition) including who your opponents were and the result, win or loss.
- Please include your opinion regarding the seeding of the teams in your conference as well as your opinion regarding the top 8 teams in the province in your classification.

RULE CHANGES FOR 2011 - 2012:

Please note the following changes that will be in effect

- Full foot out of bounds ([Article 20 f](#))
- Full head out of bounds and in contact with the mat ([Article 21 a](#))
- The White Paddle Challenge ([Article 34](#))
 - no video review is in effect
 - protest procedure is in place

ENTRY:

1. All wrestlers from registered schools outside Regina and Saskatoon **MUST** attend this meet in order to qualify for the Provincial Tournament.
2. Registered schools may enter more than one wrestler per division.
3. Every participating school **MUST** contact the commissioner, with their intent to enter, and indicate the number of competitors by the Monday preceding the regional tournament. Competitors who have not been pre-registered by their coaches will not be allowed to participate in the tournament.
4. **This will be a one-day meet.** Weigh-in will be done by fax. Skin-check will start at 9:00 a.m. and wrestling will begin at 10:00 a.m.
5. The Saskatchewan District team that advances to the Provincial Tournament will consist of up to four qualifiers from this meet per weight division.
6. The coaches present will select the "District" coaching staff. (Head and Assistant Coach.)
7. The District Coaches in consultation with the commissioner will select the final district team.

WEIGH-IN:

A weigh-in will not be held at the Regional tournament. **Each wrestler must weigh in at their home school. A school administrator or their designate must certify the weight. Certified weights must be faxed to the host commissioner by 12:00 p.m. on the Thursday preceding the meet (March 1, 2012).** Note this procedure is used for the regional meet only.

Benefits of Multiple-sport Participation Outweigh Sport Specialization

There are many benefits for students who participate in co-curricular activities, which are inherently educational and support the academic mission of our schools.

Activities teach students lessons that lead to being better citizens, and they foster success for students in later life. Students who participate in school activities make higher grades and have better attendance than the average students. Participating students also have fewer discipline issues at school, are more likely to attend college and less likely to drop out of school.

Given all of these benefits, students need to be involved in school activities! However, changes in society have led to the expansion of “travel ball” and sport specialization. School programs are being devalued and students are dropping out of sports at an alarming rate, which has led to concern regarding the future of high school athletics.

Students participate in sports for a variety of reasons, according to a recent survey. The top five reasons are to have fun, to do something they are good at, to stay in shape, to learn new or improve current skills and to play as part of a team. Interestingly, “to win” was ranked eighth.

Despite these tremendous benefits of participating in sports, a number of students are dropping out of sports each year. The reasons given were no longer interested in sports, no longer having fun, problems with coach, financial concerns, wanting to do something different and sport specialization.

Sport specialization is defined as limiting athletic participation to one sport, where students practice, train and compete solely in that sport year-round. Specialization has increased significantly in the past 15 years, championed on the national level by golfing and tennis greats Tiger Woods, Andre Agassi, Serena Williams and Venus Williams.

Why do students choose to specialize? The biggest reason is parents. Many parents encourage specialization because they believe it is an investment in a future scholarship. Students also specialize because of professional aspirations and the revenue that comes with being a professional, and to win the “national championship” with their AAU, Junior Olympics or travel team.

There are many other reasons that students choose to specialize – early college recruiting, pressure from coaches (if you work at it, you’ll get to play or even start), weather/geography, socioeconomic factors, sport commercialization, increased pressure and opportunity to play with private club and travel teams, and the general influence of society that wants youth to be a productive age instead of an experimentation age.

Parents and students who choose to specialize believe that specialization increases the chance for college scholarships. Students think they will be able to develop their skills in that sport because of the increased practice time. Parents and students feel that specializing is needed in order to keep up with others, and it satisfies the student’s desire to achieve excellence in their sport. Some view specialization as a way for a marginal player to make the varsity team. They also feel that specialization is a great way to avoid injury in another sport.

What about being a multiple-sport athlete? There are many great athletes who were multiple-sport participants, and at a high level. Just to name a few – Hakeem Olajuwon, Carl Crawford, John Elway, Dave Winfield, Jackie Robinson, Babe Didrikson, Jim Brown, Deion Sanders, Bo Jackson, Jim Thorpe, Tom Brady, Dan Marino, Donovan McNabb, Terrell Owens, Joe Mauer, LeBron James, Roger Federer, Alex Rodriguez, and the list goes on and on. With all of these multi-million dollar athletes being multi-sport participants, it’s hard to argue against it.

Benefits of Participating in Multiple Sports

So, what are the benefits of being a multiple-sport participant? **Improved health and wellness is one of the benefits.** Students who participate in more than one sport have reduced risk of overuse injuries and stress that leads to burnout. There are many health benefits to varied physical activity.

Multiple-sport students also show improved athletic performance. Cross-training (using different muscles and skills) leads to better athleticism, better leadership and teamwork skills, and better mental development, and makes it easier for multiple-sport students to pick on new skills.

Being involved in more sports leads to character development as well. Students may not excel in all of their sports, so they learn humility and teamwork. They also learn from the different coaching styles and personalities in the different sports.

Multiple-sport participation also provides improved coaching. School coaches understand that there is more to teaching our students than just the sport. Being with our school coaches is better for our students than being with a select or travel coach who may not worry about teaching life lessons. There are many CEOs of major companies who believe that hiring a person who was a multiple-sport participant is important because people who do multiple things are capable of handling different situations.

With regard to scholarships, most college coaches prefer the multiple-sport athlete because he or she is “ready to go,” and not likely to be burned out. He or she is usually more adaptable, less concerned with being a star and has better crossover skills.

Following are some things to consider when making the decision to specialize or play multiple sports:

1. Weight room and off-season conditioning is not a substitute for competition.
2. Specialization often conflicts with the educational mission of schools, where the goal should be to provide athletic programs that lead to the greatest personal growth.
3. There is little to suggest that specialization makes an athlete better at a sport. Yes, there are examples, but there are just as many “latecomer” examples as well.
4. When a student specializes, it is not what he or she is gaining, it is more about what a student is losing – the socialization with a slightly different peer group, a different coaching model and seeing things in a different context than if the individual played a variety of sports each year.
5. While this generation of athletes may become highly competent in a certain range of skills, a growing number lack the balance that diverse exposure to sports and other activities have traditionally offered.
6. With pressure to succeed hinging on one sport, the consequent anxiety often leads to burnout.
7. Playing sports in high school provides the best opportunity to learn time management in preparation for college and life after college.
8. Evidence shows that those who specialize in sports at a young age are less likely to be physically active as adults.

Some of the common arguments against sport specialization are:

- Overuse injuries,
- Burnout,
- Dilutes the talent pool in schools,
- Denies students meaningful contact with other coaches and students,
- Denies students transferable skills,
- Students might not discover their best sport, and
- May pit athletes vs. coaches and/or coaches vs. coaches.

The more frequently mentioned arguments for multiple-sport participation are:

- Develops multiple identities,
- Cushions against failure,
- Reduces overuse injuries and burnout,
- Positive skill transfer
- Sports sampling provides more options for later sport activity,
- Positive values,
- Reduces stress, and
- FUN!!!

How do we reverse the trend and get students to value being a multiple-sport participant? First, school leaders must educate parents and students about the benefits of being involved in multiple sports and the drawbacks to specialization, then hire coaches with a similar philosophy and who coach multiple sports.

Multiple-sport athletes should be honoured with special awards and recognitions, and multiple-sport participation should be promoted in athletic handbooks and publications. Students should be encouraged to develop diversified lifestyles.

Off-season workouts and camps should be scheduled so that students are not forced to choose one over the other. Students need to be reminded that they get only one shot at high school and need to make the most of that opportunity by being involved in as many school activities as possible.

Interscholastic sports promote citizenship and sportsmanship. They instil a sense of pride in community and teach lifelong lessons of teamwork and self-discipline, interscholastic sports facilitate the physical and emotional development of our nation’s youth. Students and parents need to be educated on the benefits of our programs and multiple activity participation, and students will greatly benefit from multiple-sport participation through interscholastic athletic programs.
