**Constitution
06/01/01***

BE IT RESOLVED that in preparation for the reorganization of the districts within the SHSAA, the following constitutional change be accepted, effective June 2006.

ORGANIZATION

Districts

1. The province shall be divided into districts, based on the school divisions established under **The Education Act 2005**, and the boundaries of the districts shall be as determined by **public school division boundaries as determined by The Education Act 2005**.

BE IT RESOLVED that in preparation for the reorganization of the districts within the SHSAA, the following constitutional change be accepted, effective June 2006.

VOTING DELEGATES

2. A majority of Provincial Council voting delegates shall constitute a quorum for any general meeting of the Association. (Example: **fourteen** districts x seven voting delegates = **98** votes, a quorum would be **fifty** voting delegates.)

BE IT RESOLVED that in preparation for the reorganization of the districts within the SHSAA, the following constitutional change be accepted, effective June 2006.

SPECIAL GENERAL MEETINGS

1. The President may call a Special General Meeting of the Association, when the President considers it necessary, upon giving 2 weeks written notice to all Members.
2. The President shall call a Special General Meeting of the Association when requested to do so, in writing, by at least one half of the members of the Executive Council.
3. The President shall call a Special General Meeting when requested to do so, in writing, by more than **seven** Members.
4. Voting at any general meeting of the Association shall be by the Provincial Council.

BE IT RESOLVED that in preparation for the reorganization of the districts within the SHSAA, the following bylaw change be accepted, effective June 2006.

1. The province shall be divided into **fourteen districts according to the boundaries of the fourteen public school divisions established by the Government of Saskatchewan, effective January 2006 and listed below. All schools located within the defined boundaries of the public school divisions be they public, separate, private, independent, band controlled or division scolaire francophone schools will make up an SHSAA District as follows:**
 - a) District #1: All schools located within the boundaries established for the North West SD #203 and the west portion of the Northern Lights SD.
COLOURS: TBD (previously White and Scarlet).
 - b) District #2: All schools located within the boundaries established for the Saskatchewan Rivers SD #201 and the central portion of the Northern Lights SD.
COLOURS: TBD (previously Gold and Maroon).
 - c) District #3: All schools located within the boundaries established for the North East SD #200 and the east portion of the Northern Lights SD.
COLOURS: TBD (previously Black and Gold).
 - d) District #4: All schools located within the boundaries established for the Living Sky SD #202.
COLOURS: TBD.
 - e) District #5: All schools located within the boundaries established for the Prairie Spirit SD #206.
COLOURS: TBD.
 - f) District #6: All schools located within the boundaries established for the Horizon SD #205.
COLOURS: TBD (previously Gold and Blue).
 - g) District #7: All schools located within the boundaries established for the Good Spirit SD #204.
COLOURS: TBD (previously Grey and Blue).
 - h) District #8 - SASKATOON: All schools located within the boundaries established for the Saskatoon SD #13.
COLOURS: TBD (previously Gold and Green).
 - i) District #9 - REGINA: All schools located within the boundaries established for the Regina SD #4; Regina RCSSD #81.
COLOURS: TBD (previously Light Blue and Dark Blue).
 - j) District #10: All schools located within the boundaries established for the Sun West SD #207.
COLOURS: TBD (previously White and Blue).
 - k) District #11: All schools located within the boundaries established for the Prairie Valley SD #208.

 - l) District #12: All schools located within the boundaries established for the Chinook SD #211.
COLOURS: TBD (previously Blue and White).
 - m) District #13: All schools located within the boundaries established for the Prairie South SD #210.
COLOURS: TBD (previously Red, Blue and White).
 - n) District #14: All schools located within the boundaries established for the South East Cornerstone SD #209.
COLOURS: TBD (previously Red and Black).
2. A Member may apply to the Executive Council to have a school or schools under their jurisdiction participate in another District for competition purposes. In such situations, both affected Districts must be in agreement.

- Section Four: **Districts 1, 4, 5 and 10.**

Interschool Competition

2. **The playoffs leading to the provincial championship in the ten SHSAA activities would be as follows:**

NON-CLASSIFIED ACTIVITIES

Non-classified activities will advance through two levels of playoffs to determine provincial champions. School representatives will participate in District play downs to determine representatives to the provincial championship golf, cross-country, curling, badminton, track and wrestling).

CLASSIFIED ACTIVITIES

Classified Activities will advance teams through three levels of play to determine provincial champions. Playoffs at the conference, regional and provincial level will be organized by the SHSAA office and conducted by the school named by the District to host on their behalf (soccer, football, volleyball and basketball).

BLANKET SANCTION

BE IT RESOLVED that the SHSAA accept the following contract with regards to Basketball Officials as requested by SABO to negotiate a three-year agreement for basketball officiating services at Hoopla

Whereas the Saskatchewan High Schools Athletic Association (SHSAA) requires the services of basketball officials at HOOPLA; and whereas the Saskatchewan Association of Basketball Officials (SABO) is the organization responsible for the provision of basketball officiating services in the province; the following shall constitute an agreement of the terms of the arrangement whereby SABO officials are contracted to officiate SHSAA games at HOOPLA 2007; 2008; 2009.

The SHSAA and its member institutions shall:

1. Provide a safe, secure environment for the conduct of SHSAA basketball games. SHSAA will provide an on-site person to be responsible for the safety of the officials from their time of arrival to their final departure from the school premises.
2. Provide a secured change room separate from any teams competing.
3. Provide a written schedule of games well in advance of play.
4. Provide a remuneration for officials services at the following agreed upon rates:
 - i. Hoopla Games: **\$33 per official per game**
 - ii. Hotels: Accommodation paid for by the SHSAA at the local host hotel as a maximum of two people per room (Reservations made by the SHSAA).
 - iii. Meals: Approved per diem of \$30 per day for those officials from outside the host city. Per Diem of \$10 per day for those within the host city. Per diems shall be calculated to include time travelled to and from their home city.
 - iv. **Mileage: Mileage recovery as per prevailing Government of Saskatchewan rates (April 1, 2006 = 38.40 cents/ km). A callout fee of \$15.00 paid to each official who is a passenger in each car.**
 - v. **Honorarium: Pay to SABO an honorarium of \$300 for the provision and administration of services for officials at HOOPLA.**
5. **Agrees to SABO providing evaluators for HOOPLA, one evaluator per four officials.**
6. **Provide and pay for the accommodations for the evaluators at the local host hotel at a maximum of two people per room. (Reservation made by the SHSAA)**
7. When necessary, provide written documentation concerning an official's performance, behaviour and/or conduct to the SABO's evaluation/assigning committee chairperson.
8. Deal with any incidents of abuse directed towards officials by SHSAA participants as reported by SABO, in accordance with SHSAA policy and guidelines.
9. Provide the SHSAA incident report forms for any HOOPLA game where an ejection or flagrant foul is assessed by the officials immediately following completion of the game. The forms shall be provided to the officials in the change room.
10. Selection of officials for HOOPLA will be done in the following manner: The SHSAA designate will seek nominations to officiate at HOOPLA from the SHSAA districts, then collaborate on selection with the SABO designate from the list of nominations. The final list will be given to SABO by the SHSAA to officiate at HOOPLA.
11. Assignment and evaluation of officials for HOOPLA will be done in the following manner: The SABO designate will assign and evaluate officials to all scheduled HOOPLA games. The SABO designate may consult selected evaluators to determine appropriate assignments for each official. The completed assignment schedule will be presented to the SHSAA designate for endorsement.

SABO and its member officials shall:

1. Officiate all scheduled SHSAA HOOPLA games staged in Saskatchewan.
2. Designate a SABO evaluation/assigning chairperson responsible for the selection, administration, evaluation and supervision of HOOPLA officials' assignments and for dealing with any concerns between the SHSAA and the officials.
3. SABO will pay for all evaluator honorariums and travel expenses.
4. Complete the SHSAA incident report forms for any HOOPLA game where an ejection or flagrant foul is assessed. The report must be completed in its entirety, in a clear and legible manner before leaving the venue, and forwarded to the onsite contact.
5. Comply with the indicated SHSAA invoicing procedures (see attached appendix)
6. Respond to concerns expressed by the SHSAA about the performance or behaviour of any official working HOOPLA games.
7. Report unacceptable behaviour of a HOOPLA player, coach, or official to the SHSAA official's commissioner for basketball.

APPENDIX

By following these guidelines, the SHSAA and SABO will maintain accurate records and ensure the prompt payment of invoices.

1. An SHSAA representative will participate in the first meeting of the officials conducted at HOOPLA to provide expense claims for each official. The signed expense claims will be collected at the meeting. The first meeting of officials will take place on the Thursday evening of HOOPLA.
2. SHSAA and SABO agree that all officials, evaluators and the SHSAA designate are required to be in attendance at the first meeting of officials.
3. The SHSAA will reimburse all SABO officials within seven days of the conclusion of HOOPLA as per the submitted expense claims.
4. The SHSAA shall pay for officials' travel expenses providing that the travel is necessary and that the expense is kept to a minimum (i.e. car pool where possible at a maximum of 3 people per car). Officials requiring overnight accommodations must use the SHAA booked and approved host hotel. In the case of inclement weather and where highway travel is not recommended, hotels will be provided for Saturday evening if required.
5. **Ground Transportation:**
 - i. **Mileage – Mileage rates will be based on prevailing Government of Saskatchewan rates as well as a per passenger callout fee. (April 1, 2006 = 38.40 cents/ km). A callout fee of \$15.00 paid to each official who is a passenger in each car.**
6. Per Diems:
 - i. Travelling Officials: Approved per diem of \$10 per meal.
 - ii. Host City Officials: Per Diem of \$10 per day.

Saskatoon District WITHDRAWN

06/03/06

BE IT RESOLVED that the SHSAA create an officials award for each District similar to the SHSAA Outstanding Coach Award.

Criteria:

- a) Contribute to the District by providing a valuable service to the activities offered by the District.
- b) Act as a proponent of good sportsmanship by officiating with these ideals in mind whenever officiating.
- c) Regularly attending clinics in the activity officiated to show an interest in improving and keeping up to date with the current trends in officiating.

RATIONALE: The SHSAA currently provides an award to the outstanding coaches in each district. In an attempt to increase the recognition of a valuable commodity in each district, the SHSAA is attempting to encourage new officials and retain the officials it already has in its programs.

Guiding Principles for Provincial Championships

GUIDING PRINCIPLES

Student-Athlete Welfare

The SHSAA is committed to amateurism, student-athlete welfare, gender equity, sportsmanship and fair play, cultural diversity and the overall athletic experience. This will be reflected in every aspect of the athletic administrative operations and decisions.

Provincial Championships

The SHSAA plans and coordinates all playoffs leading to the provincial championships. Districts and school divisions plan and coordinate interschool athletic competitions and organize and support playoffs at the school division and SHSAA district level as proposed by the SHSAA.

Fair Competition

The competition among teams in playoffs leading to the provincial championships is genuine yet fair to ensure that each participating team has a reasonable chance to be successful.

Personal Development

The competitive environment, application of rules and conduct of athletes, coaches and officials contribute positively to achievement of the social, personal and citizenship goals of education.

Celebration of Excellence

The overriding purpose of provincial championships is to celebrate team and individual athlete success, participation and demonstration of the benefits and qualities of sportsmanship. Every effort is made to recognize each of these benefits of high school athletic competition.

Competitive Advancement

The advancement of individual athletes and teams to a provincial championship is by a series of playoff competitions. It is generally given that playoffs leading to the provincial championship may include playoffs at the school, school division, SHSAA district or conference, regional and provincial final levels. The number of meaningful and manageable playoffs necessary to eliminate to the provincial final event will determine the number of levels and sequence of playoffs.

Efficient Scheduling

The scheduling of playoffs must respect 'instructional time in the classroom', however, it is also acknowledged that there is great educational value derived from participation in competitive playoffs leading to the provincial championship. It is inevitable that some classroom instructional time will be directed into the athletic opportunities for student athletes. Playoffs leading to the provincial championship should respect economic implications, travel time and absence from school.

Consistent Application

The guiding principles are applied consistently across all sports and levels of championship competition and from year to year to ensure meaningful and manageable levels of play. Therefore the classification structure for team sport and the playoff structure leading to the provincial championship must be consistent. Individual sports should also follow a consistent level of playoffs albeit they may differ from team sport playoffs.

Number of Teams in Championships

The maximum number of teams permitted to play in playoffs leading to a provincial championship is the least reasonable number in consideration of the sport to ensure efficient management and delivery of a safe and competitive event.

Classification

Classification of team sports is based on the number of students eligible to participate on behalf of the school. This is generally considered the fairest way to classify. It is acknowledged a larger student population provides more athletes to the school program, therefore a more competitive team. Classification is not intended to provide equal number of teams in each classification. It is the intent of classification to identify competitive levels of play using population of schools to define the levels.

 - Conferences with eight or fewer teams, will participate in one conference tournament with four teams advancing to one of four regional tournaments.
- ❖ Regional
 - Field of 16 teams playing in one of four regional playoff tournaments
 - One team from each regional playoff will advance to the provincial final tournament
- ❖ Provincial
 - 4 teams
 - 1 team from each of the four regional tournaments
 - One game per day; day one winners play for gold; day one losers play for bronze
 - Played at Hoopla

5A

Teams will advance to one of two regional tournaments. Each regional will advance two teams to the provincial championship.

6A

Teams will advance from the city league playoffs to the provincial championship.

06/05/05 **BE IT RESOLVED** that the 6A category for basketball has the same number of teams at Hoopla as the 1A, 2A, 3A, 4A and 5A categories.

North Central District WITHDRAWN

 - Senior Girls
 - Junior Boys
 - Junior Girls
 - Midget Boys
 - Midget Girls
- ❖ Provincial
 - Top 10 runners per district per age category

SHSAA Executive CARRIED

06/06/02 **BE IT RESOLVED** that the provincial cross country championships shorten the distance of the boys races so the midget boys run 3 km and the junior and senior boys run 4 km.

North East District DEFEATED

06/06/03 **BE IT RESOLVED** that the SHSAA investigate the Hytek program (currently used in track) for the cross-country provincials.

Saskatoon District CARRIED

06/06/04 **BE IT RESOLVED** that the SHSAA amend the Team Awards at Provincial Cross Country to be as follows:

Team Awards:

- a) SHSAA provincial keeper plaque for the school to the School Team champion, second place and third place finishers in each classification.
- b) SHSAA medals to the members of the gold, silver and bronze medal school team in each classification (maximum 6-medals).

BE IT RESOLVED that the SHSAA adopt a twelve team triple knockout for the provincial championship for curling consisting of three teams advancing out of the three regions not hosting provincials. The top two teams plus a host team would advance from the region awarded the provincial championship beginning the 2006/07 school year.

South Central District..... WITHDRAWN

06/07/05

BE IT RESOLVED that the SHSAA adopt a ten team provincial championship with a page playoff for curling, consisting of first and second place teams advancing from each regional. The host plus an additional team would be included from the regional that includes the previous year's gold medal winning district. This would begin in the 2007 season.

South Central District..... WITHDRAWN

06/07/06

BE IT RESOLVED that the SHSAA adopt an eight modified triple provincial championship for curling consisting of first and second place teams advancing out of the three regions not hosting provincials. The top team plus a host team would advance from the region awarded the provincial championship, beginning the 2006/07 school year.

South Central District..... WITHDRAWN

06/07/07

BE IT RESOLVED that the SHSAA adopt an eight team triple provincial championship with a page playoff for curling consisting of first and second place teams advancing out of the three regions not hosting provincials. The top team plus a host team would advance from the region awarded the provincial championship, beginning the 2006/07 school year.

South Central District..... WITHDRAWN

06/07/08

BE IT RESOLVED that the SHSAA pursue the direction of the Saskatchewan Curling Association to implement their Page System format for the SHSAA playoffs at provincials.

Where the A Event Winner plays the B Event Winner in one game the two C Event Winners play one another, one C Event Team would be eliminated. The winner of the A & B Event games goes to the Gold Medal Final. The loser of the A & B Events plays the winner of the C Event game.
