- f) President's Address

I welcome all of you to Lloydminster and our 2007 Annual General Meeting. I am sure our meetings over the next two days will be conducted in a professional and productive manner for our Association.

The Saskatchewan High Schools Athletic Association has seen significant growth and change in

educational sport over the past few years. Schools and the Association have made the adjustments to handle the realignment of school divisions. Our office staff, Larry Lafrentz, Kevin Vollet, Kim Platt and Jessica Blair, all deserve huge credit for fielding questions, handling problems and making our system work. There will continue to be growth and with the skill and experience of these people at the helm, I am sure it will continue to happen, as it should. Our executive continues to be the most dedicated group of people I have ever worked with and they do an amazing amount of volunteer work for the SHSAA. Welcome to those who will come aboard this year and fond farewell to those who are leaving the Executive Council.

I hope to see the SHSAA continue to explore expanding its educational role as it has done with our recent Women In Sport pilot conference in Saskatoon organized by Vicki Moore from our executive and with projects like our Official's Development Committee that we will try to expand upon in our forward planning session this morning. Our promotional video is approaching completion in the hands of Angela Tillier and her Luther crew. These types of endeavours only serve to solidify the role of high school sport in the education of our youth.

With the addition of Activities Coordinators, or Athletic Directors, by any name, we should be able to reach more and more students with specialty projects. Worthwhile projects that I have been made aware of at other conferences include Captain Workshops to enhance the ability of our team captains to lead in constructive ways and encourage the lifestyle we would like to see modelled by our athletes. Another is a workshop to lend expertise to using computer programs in student team manager situations or learning to effectively communicate results, photographs or statistics in a multimedia context. The doors are wide open to possibilities.

I would like to stress what I see as the greatest strength of high school sport in Saskatchewan. The

SHSAA, with great credit extended to our executive directors over the past many years, has achieved a position of great respect among provincial school sport bodies from across Canada. I believe this is largely due to the unity of purpose and the diversity of the member schools, which make up our association. Small schools & large schools all have educational philosophies that are shared and have only the best interests of our student athletes at heart. The fact that all of our schools work together gives us this powerful presence as a group. At our annual meetings it is important that all participants recognize a duty to educate themselves about the impact of resolutions on student athletes whether they be from a large or small school. The "this does not affect us so it does not matter" statement should be stricken from our meeting vocabulary. Prepare to do the right thing for high school athletics in Saskatchewan. This attitude also gives us understanding of all the situations that exist and makes us compassionate to other's needs rather than only the personal ones in our school situation.

I have a hard time imagining teaching for all these years without being involved in athletics. My most treasured memories come from the field or gym where hard work and dedication have been put to the test. If I could inspire our young teachers to take on extracurricular activities as teacher coaches or supervisors, it would be an undertaking I would leap forward to do. From a personal point of view, I shared a similar plight to many beginning teachers when I started – I literally knew very little about the activities I now coach. I am a slow learner and it is still amazing what one can learn in a lifetime. My message to young teachers is, get involved, you will make unforgettable memories and friends.

I have recently reflected back on my teaching experiences and made the decision to retire effective June 30, 2007. My resignation initiates what I feel is a transition for the SHSAA. Effective June 30, 2008, Larry Lafrentz will be retiring as Executive Director. To facilitate a smooth transfer of leadership, our Executive Council has hired Kevin Vollet as Executive Director of the SHSAA effective July 1, 2008. I know Kevin looks forward to serving high school athletics in this new capacity and I know he will do very well. In October, we will begin the advertising process for a new Assistant Executive Director of the SHSAA.

As part of my reflections leading up to this meeting, I took note of how often I hear "you SHSAA people" or "that organization" from teacher coaches who are in reality, THE SHSAA. If you are a District President you are an important connection to the Executive and this is one more educational process you could embark on. The teacher who takes on the role of Athletic Director in a school and looks for coaches is "SHSAA". The teacher who coaches or supervises any team is "SHSAA". The principal who looks after the school and all of its programs is "SHSAA". Our student athletes are an integral part of the SHSAA. If this message could be conveyed, it would only make things better in our province in our attempts to promote our goals and vision for school sport.

Though she is not here, I would be remiss in not thanking my lifelong partner/friend, Valerie. We have worked together in every project or team we have had in our school. Fund-raising projects, tournaments and sport pictures have all been her thing to organize. She even coached for many years. Few people realize her

contributions to what I do and thanks have been sparse for her efforts. My family, including my two daughters, Jasmine and Jillian, have always been an integral part of my school sport experience and I am so grateful that coaching has always been a family affair for me. I know my granddaughter will someday be a school sport athlete.

As I say farewell to you, the people in the trenches of the SHSAA, I bid farewell to friends. You are friends because of our shared love of high school sport and our shared vision for our high school athletes. I know the future of high school sport is in very good hands.

h) Executive Director's Report

Welcome to the 59th annual general meeting of the Saskatchewan High Schools Athletic Association. Thank you to the 161 people that have taken the time and made the effort to be here, to participate in the business affairs of the Association. Also, thank you to the North West District who are proving to be great hosts. I want to take this opportunity to acknowledge the work of the North West committee headed up by Tim Johnstone from Meadow Lake Carpenter High School.

In my opinion, 2006 – 2007 has been an interesting and incredible year for the Association. This past September, following three years of preparation and planning for the reorganization of the Association and embarking on a new concept for playoffs leading to provincial championships in team sport - it was time for it all to work in the real world and not just be a concept on paper. The amount of time and effort put in by each district association, the executive council and the staff of the SHSAA office provided the interschool athletic program for students across the province as if nothing had changed. That is a credit to each and every one of you in this room and the hundreds of other volunteers that step up every year to provide this SHSAA program in each Saskatchewan school. Every year at this time I think of the magnitude of the commitment required to deliver interschool sport and every year I am humbled and proud to be associated with you the people that make up the SHSAA.

I do not want to leave you with the impression that everything went better than imagined, indeed we made a few mistakes and following the experience gained this year we will certainly will do some things differently in conference, regional and provincial playoffs. A number of resolutions to this meeting will address some of the changes we believe are required. Other changes will occur in the manner that the conferences are organized, explained and identified to the membership and the public. The knowledge gained from our experience in the fall season with soccer and volleyball was applied to the basketball playoffs. Changes and adjustments will be ongoing to these events based on the feedback received from host schools and participants. Your input is wanted and is critical to the success of the playoff structure. We need to encourage every school to participate and place the conference playoff date on their competitive calendar and then fulfill the commitment to participate in the playoff.

Another aspect of the year that was considerably different and quite refreshing was that the

executive council's time together was not consumed with reorganization plans and playoff structures. The forward planning session for the year was able to identify and focus on other issues and projects that have had to take a backseat during reorganization. Wade briefly mentioned the Women In Sport Conference that was held two weeks ago. This was an idea that came from a brainstorming session and became a reality this year as a pilot project. Under the direction of an executive council committee and the leadership of the chairperson, Vicki Moore, this conference became a reality. In cooperation with the University of Saskatchewan, faculty of Kinesiology, this conference brought together 60 female high schools students, 15 female coaches, 7 university athletes and a dozen leaders in sport and physical activity for the purpose of enhancing knowledge, attitudes and beliefs of young women and university students regarding the role that sport and physical activity can play in the lives of young women, and understanding the barriers that limit participation in physical activity and sport. In addition, the development of leadership skills to facilitate the involvement of women in sport and physical activity was a key focus of the conference.

All reports are that it was an enormous success.

It will be up to the incoming executive council to evaluate the conference and determine if this is an ongoing project for the SHSAA.

Ideas like the Women In Sport Conference and the work done on the classification proposal and officials development are products of the initiatives taken on by the executive this past year.

There are other issues that need to be addressed and other initiatives that need to be explored. You, the provincial council, and the incoming executive council need to identify and address other issues that affect the Association. Things like the number of contests during the year in an activity, traditional activities vs. new or added activities wishing access to the SHSAA calendar of events. We have been meeting with a contingent from cheerleading that would like to see their activity be the next approved and recognized provincial championship in the SHSAA program. We also need to pay attention to the trend to sport specific education programs for curriculum credit and whether they are an enhancement to or in conflict with our stated objectives.

Last year I mentioned in my report that we are experiencing a changing of the guard in most districts and I challenged the veterans to mentor and recruit new young people, to convince these newcomers of the importance and rewards to be achieved by taking an active role in interschool sport, just as our mentors did for each of us when we broke into the teaching profession. When I made those comments I was not thinking about our President, Wade Weseen, choosing to retire this year or my own impending retirement one-year from now. Those two things illustrate to me how quickly things change and how important it is to encourage and allow our future leaders to participate and have a voice in the process of this annual meeting and the functioning of each district association.

My report would be incomplete without acknowledging the dedication to school sport and the support of our corporate sponsors. When we review the financial statement for the year it will be clear how important their support is to the success of school sport.

The symposium committee has put together another outstanding list of presenters and the camaraderie and contacts developed at the symposium will aid any coach.

I must remind you of the need to get on-line to the SHSAA ExNet database and update the school information listed for your school. Correct e-mail addresses are critical to ensure proper communication to your school. Please list personnel changes and make any other updates before you leave in June. The information recorded there will be published in the new handbook and directory distributed to all schools in the fall.

I spoke earlier of what a great year we have had as an Association, as an executive council and as an office staff. It has been a great year because of the people involved and the passion exhibited for school sport. There was no greater illustration of this than at our recent track championships in Yorkton, 1,450 athletes and hundreds of coaches came together to compete and celebrate a year of activity, this was our largest ever event. Thank you to you as coaches and organizers of SHSAA activities. Thank you to the Executive Council you have put in place to manage the affairs of the Association and Thank You to my staff, Kevin Vollet, Kim Platt and Jessica Blair they too share that passion and pride in being involved. On their behalf and mine, thank you for the opportunity to serve the SHSAA.
