Executive Director's Report

Welcome back to school. I trust you had a great holiday with family and friends and are energized for the winter and spring athletic seasons to come in 2007.

Energy was a precious commodity as the Association worked its way through the first fall season using the conference, regional, provincial playoff model approved at the 2006 AGM. Effort by so many individuals made for a better than imagined fall season. Thank you must be delivered to each commissioner of conference, regional and provincial playoff events. The leadership shown time and time again by teachers willing to act as commissioners for these events and involve staff and students in all aspects of the planning and delivery of each event is truly remarkable, particularly when many were done on short notice. The playoff structure only allows one-week notice in most cases, as teams must earn the right to advance. Efficiency of the District official's commissioners and their referee-in-chiefs to provide competent officiating for each event was appreciated by this office and the athletes and coaches involved in the fall activities. Having said all that I want people to know we also saw room for improvement based on our first time experience and future meetings and planning sessions will reveal ideas for the coming year.

The SHSAA Executive Council has been involved in more forward planning and are discussing and planning two new initiatives for this year. One involves official's development and the other is a project to encourage female participation in athletics. Watch for more information as the new year progresses. Other issues on the table are coach and official relationships, improving communication at all levels but particularly with non-faculty coaches and classification of team sport. Many discussions have taken place in the past few years about the need for adjustments to classification numbers. Now that the districts are re-organized and a playoff structure is in place I believe it is time to move on this topic. The numbers of classifications, population in each class, whether different numbers are necessary for each activity, all need to be examined. The Executive Council will be required to bring forward a discussion paper for consideration this June.

A piece of business overlooked this fall was the need for host schools for two provincial volleyball championships to be hosted in 2007. **Bids will be accepted by the Executive Council from any school involved in 5A Girls and 2A Boys Volleyball.** Schools interested in hosting the respective provincial championships in November of 2007 must put forward a written bid to host by January 30, 2007. SHSAA PROVINCIAL CURLING CHAMPIONSHIPS MARCH 1 - 3, 2007

SHSAA curling championships will consist of 16 teams competing in a triple-knockout competition with the final four qualifiers taking part in a championship round to determine the medal places. Information about the host centers and competing teams are printed below, including their position on the draw. Second representative teams are chosen from the previous years championship district and from the neighbouring districts to this years curling venue that have the largest number of curling teams entered in the SHSAA program. A random draw, held in the SHSAA office, determines the placing on the draw. (Except districts with two representatives, one representative is placed in the top half the other rep in the bottom half). Once a school qualifies, you must contact the provincial commissioner and SHSAA office. **Please NOTIFY the PROVINCIAL commissioner and the SHSAA office by noon Monday, February 26, 2007 or earlier.**

SHSAA BASKETBALL PLAYOFFS

CONFERENCE

In the **1A, 2A, 3A and 4A categories**, all registered basketball teams have been placed in a geographical conference. The registered teams in each category have been divided into four conferences based on equal number of teams. The teams designated to each particular conference are listed in the tables that follow as well as appear on the SHSAA web site. The SHSAA office will seed each conference tournament. Be sure to fill out and submit a seeding form including your opinion on the seeding of the conference and the province.

There are a number of conference tournaments that have yet to be designated to a particular school by the host district. If your school is in a conference without a designated host (***bold and italicized print***), and would like to host the conference tournament designated to your district, you must apply to your district executive. The final document listing the conference teams and designated hosts will be posted to the SHSAA web site on February 1, 2007.

SEEDING OF TEAMS FOR CONFERENCE AND REGIONAL PLAYOFFS **Seeding forms are due into the SHSAA office on or before February 23, 2007.**

To seed the basketball playoffs the cooperation and input from all coaches is requested. The SHSAA office requires written confirmation of season results from **ALL BASKETBALL TEAMS**. Include results of all games played (tournament, league, exhibition) including who your opponents were and the result, win or loss. Also, include your opinion as a coach regarding the top 8 teams in your conference AND include in the provincial seeding box, your top 8 teams in your classification. Submit them to the SHSAA office by **Friday, February 23, 2007**.

All teams in the conference playoffs will participate in a single elimination tournament that will qualify either two teams (1A – 3A Boys and Girls) or four teams (4A Boys). The single elimination draws (4,5 or 6 team tournaments) appear on the SHSAA web site.

All conference tournaments will be played on March 2 & 3, 2007. The draws will be posted on the SHSAA web site on February 26, 2007. You must contact the host school to receive details of the conference playoff. The conference host will also contact all teams in the playoff to relay pertinent tournament information.

All District Officials' Commissioners should prepare to host a minimum of 2 and possibly more Conference Tournaments in each district.

Teams in **Regina** and **Saskatoon** that have a population of 251 or more male or female students in grades 10-12 will compete in **5A** basketball will qualify for the provincial championship by participating in their city championships. Four male and four female teams from each city will qualify to compete at HOOPLA.

REGIONAL

In the 1A – 3A Boys and Girls category, **two teams** will advance from each of the eight conferences to the regional playoff tournaments. The teams that qualify from the conference tournaments will then be seeded 1 to 16 and placed in one of four regional tournaments. Each Regional Tournament will qualify one team to Hoopla 2007.

In the 4A Boys category, each conference tournament will advance **four teams** to the regional playoff tournaments. The teams that qualify from the conference tournaments will also be seeded 1 – 16 and placed in one of four regional tournaments. Each Regional Tournament will qualify one team to Hoopla 2007.

Each Regional tournament (**1A, 2A, 3A, and 4A**) will consist of four (4) teams. They will compete in an A/B side tournament; the team winning the 'A' side will advance to HOOPLA. The host site for the regional playoffs will be posted on the SHSAA web site March 5th. The Regional playoff will be awarded at the completion of the seeding of each classification. We realize the short time lines involved but believe this is necessary to ensure valid seeding of the tournaments. All District Officials' Commissioners should prepare to host a minimum of 2 and possibly more Regional Tournaments in each district. Schools interested in hosting a regional basketball playoff are invited to submit a bid to host on or before January 31st. Send bids to the SHSAA office. Please check the SHSAA website for the tournament draws.

3. Every participating school **MUST** contact the commissioner, with their intent to enter, and indicate the number of competitors by the Monday preceding the regional tournament. Competitors who have not been pre-registered by their coaches will not be allowed to participate in the tournament.
4. **This will be a one-day meet.** Weigh-in will be done by fax and Wrestling will begin at 10:00 a.m.
5. The Saskatchewan District team that advances to the Provincial Tournament will consist of up to four qualifiers from this meet per weight division.
6. The coaches present will select the "District" coaching staff. (Head and Assistant Coach.)
7. The District Coaches in consultation with the commissioner will select the final district team.

WEIGH-IN:

A weigh-in will not be held at the Regional tournament. **Each wrestler must weigh in at their home school. A school administrator or their designate must certify the weight. Certified weights must be faxed to the host commissioner by 12:00 p.m. the Thursday preceding the meet (Mar. 1, 2007).** Note this procedure is used for the regional meet only.

SKIN INSPECTIONS: Skin inspections will begin at 9:30 am. All participants must pass the on-site skin inspection before wrestling.

The tournament begins at 10:00 am. Three wrestling mats are available for matches.

BADMINTON SCORING CHANGE

Effective 2006-2007

The IBF (International Badminton Federation) and Badminton Canada have adopted the rally point scoring for badminton. At the September meeting, the SHSAA Executive Council adopted this new scoring rule for high school badminton beginning with the 2006-2007 competition season.

7. SCORING SYSTEM

- 7.1 A match shall consist of the best of three games, unless otherwise arranged (Appendix 2 and 3).
7.2 A game shall be won by the side which first scores 21 points, except as provided in Law 7.4 and 7.5.
7.3 The side winning a rally shall add a point to its score. A side shall win a rally, if the opposing side commits a 'fault' or the shuttle ceases to be in play because it touches the surface of the court inside the opponent's court.
7.4 If the score becomes 20-all, the side, which gains a two-point lead first, shall win that game.
7.5 If the score becomes 29-all, the side scoring the 30th point shall win that game.
7.6 The side winning a game shall serve first in the next game.

SIMPLIFIED RALLY POINTS SCORING SYSTEM

Scoring System

A match consists of the best of 3 games of 21 points.
The side winning a rally adds a point to its score.
At 20 all, the side, which gains a 2-point lead first, wins that game.
At 29 all, the side scoring the 30th point wins that game.
The side winning a game serves first in the next game.

Intervals and Change of Ends

When the leading score reaches 11 points, players have a 60 second interval.
A 2-minute interval between each game is allowed.
In the third game, players change ends when a side scores 11 Points.

Singles

At the beginning of the game and when the server's score is even, the server serves from the right service court. When it is odd, the server serves from the left service court.
If the server wins a rally, the server scores a point and then serves again from alternate service court.
If the receiver wins a rally, the receiver scores a point and becomes the new server.

Doubles

There is only one serve in doubles (see diagram on following page). The service passes consecutively to the players as shown in the attached diagram.
At the beginning of the game and when the score is even, the server serves from the right court. When it is odd, the server serves from the left court.
If the serving side wins a rally, the serving side scores a point and the same server serves again from the alternate service court.
If the receiving side wins a rally, the receiving side scores a point. The receiving side becomes the new serving side.

The player of the receiving side who served last stays in the same service court from where he served last. The reverse pattern applies to the receiver's partner

The players do not change their respective service courts until they win a point when their side is serving.

If players commit an error in the service court, the error is corrected when the mistake is discovered.

The following is a diagram and description for doubles movement utilizing this new scoring system:

In a Doubles match between A & B against C & D. A & B won the toss and decided to serve. A to serve to C. A shall be the initial server while C shall be the initial receiver.

Creating a Culture of Good Sportsmanship

WHEN IN ROME, DO AS THE ROMANS DO

The proverb has been traced back to 1530 and is often attributed to St. Ambrose, whose advice to St. Augustine read: "When you are in Rome, live in the Roman style; when you are elsewhere, live as they live elsewhere." Essentially it means, don't set your own rules when you are someone's guest.

What does the saying have to do with creating a culture of good sportsmanship? We would do well to understand the power that the Romans held as they created their culture and apply those lessons to the issues that confront us in schools today. The power of holding fast to certain beliefs and creating the means to sustain them results in a culture that links us to those beliefs by the way we conduct business. In our efforts to create a culture of sportsmanship, we must examine very closely those core beliefs and think about what we do to support them.

Culture is not a result of the efforts that we expend at ballgames to support sportsmanship. Culture is developed in the values that we hold highest as we build relationships, enforce policy and involve the community in everyday school life. Our culture is defined in the way that we greet students in the hall and the way that we communicate with our students and parents. Sportsmanship becomes the model of those values that are most visible to the public, and the standard by which we are judged. The question most important for administrators to consider is: How do we teach the culture of our school to our staff, students and community?

Our interactions as administrators and supervisors are constantly being judged on the way that we build relationships. We cannot expect students to respond in a certain way to my interactions with them during the day, and then change those expectations at game time. If it is inappropriate in our culture to treat others rudely during the school day, then it is inappropriate in our culture to treat others rudely at game time. Ballgames become a tougher sell than the school day only if we allow students to believe that somehow we will suspend those core beliefs for a brief period while we take shots at our opponent's players, coaches and fans. The proactive administrator will think about strategies for promoting sportsmanship long before game time, and will use opportunities to teach about the expectations. Strategies include the following:

1. Create open and warm relationships with students in school-day interactions. Students get a feeling of fair play in the way we deal with their mistakes, joke with them in the hallway, greet them wherever we see them, and actively listen to the things that are important to them. Carrying these important core beliefs from the school day to the ballgame will support our efforts to build good sports.
2. Set high expectations that are modeled consistently. Good administrators are active listeners who always focus on the core beliefs of their culture. No matter where the conversation turns, good sportsmanship will require that we teach students to treat others with dignity and respect. During the school day that means saying, "Please" and "Thank you" as we go through the lunch line. That means always dealing with situations of bullying, harassment and violations of respect with prudence and consistency. Good sportsmanship will result from the game-time decisions that support the same core beliefs. While saying "Please" and "Thank you" might not be a piece of the culture for your games, applauding the opponents during the introduction of the starting line-ups might be.

3. A focus on how we treat our guests reflects a deep-seeded community tradition. I know of no place, outside of hate organizations, that nurtures an environment where guests are treated as inferior trespassers. Most hotels have “guest services.” This suggests that organizations who want to be successful in marketing their stock create policies designed to impress people and attract business. Such a notion would be a good focus for the administrator who wanted to build a solid foundation of good sportsmanship.
4. Communicate through newsletters, staff memos, newspapers and Web sites. Leave no stone unturned regarding avenues to communicate the core values of your culture. The notion of proclaiming your staff, students, parents and entire community to be the “best in the state” becomes the expectation when your culture is formed around the right core beliefs.
5. Take advantage of teachable moments. At pep rallies, empower your thespians to come up with a skit that depicts students modeling the sportsmanship you are nurturing. We did a skit about respecting the flag during the playing of the National Anthem that resulted in some great discussion in our classrooms. Educating staff about the value of classroom discussions around such topics will provide additional support for those who are interested in teaching the culture in the mathematics, science, English and social studies classrooms as well.

A discussion with students about actions at games that reflect your culture are important to gain buy-in. Flexibility and creativity are premium concepts, with a genuine give-and-take important. Yet, a concession of one of your core beliefs regarding respect is never negotiable. Simple semantics can be important. The subtle difference of: “You got swatted” versus “Nice block” could be just the ticket to preserving your own students’ need to chant and the dignity of the player whose shot was blocked. If respecting the integrity of every student is important, then chanting “Air ball” is a discussion that you must have with students who want to associate a poor shot with ridicule. If you don’t allow ridicule during your school day, don’t amend your culture to allow it for game time.

At our schools, policies are in place that supports the core beliefs of our cultures. In addition, our activities conference sponsors a sportsmanship trophy given annually to a school that best reflects the core values of competition where respect, tolerance and encouragement are held in high esteem. Of course, the task of managing students and fans at game time never is an easy one. Yet, if we allow our culture to define the guidelines, communicated our need to support those guidelines, and have worked with students and parents creating relationships and buy-in, our jobs just got easier.

When in Rome, do as the Romans do. That is, when in my school – whether it is the classroom, basketball court, volleyball court or swimming pool – live by the core beliefs that are important to our culture.

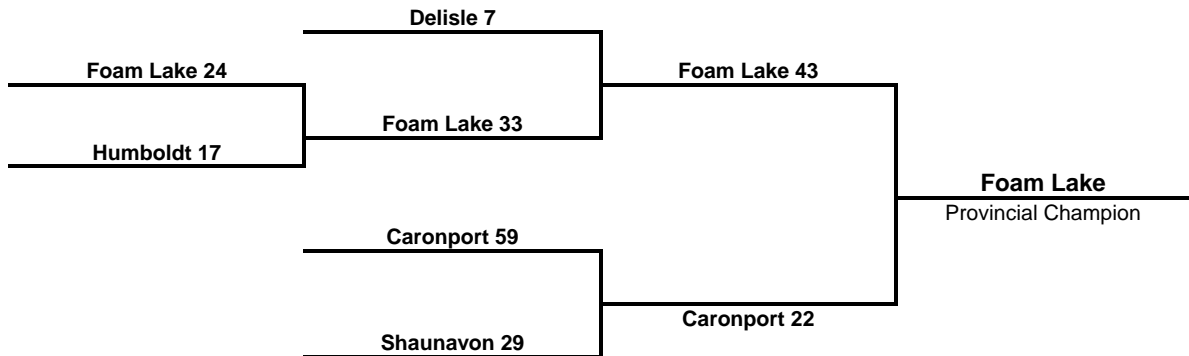

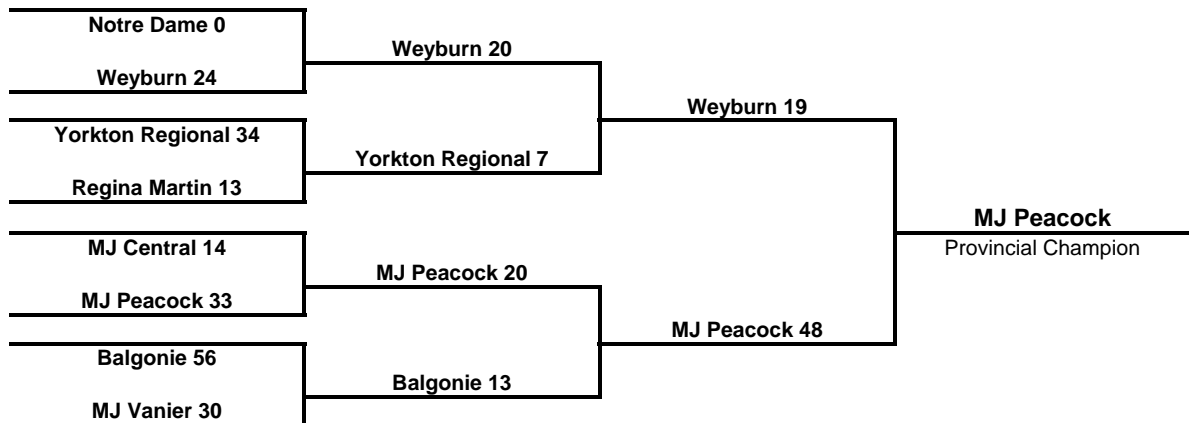

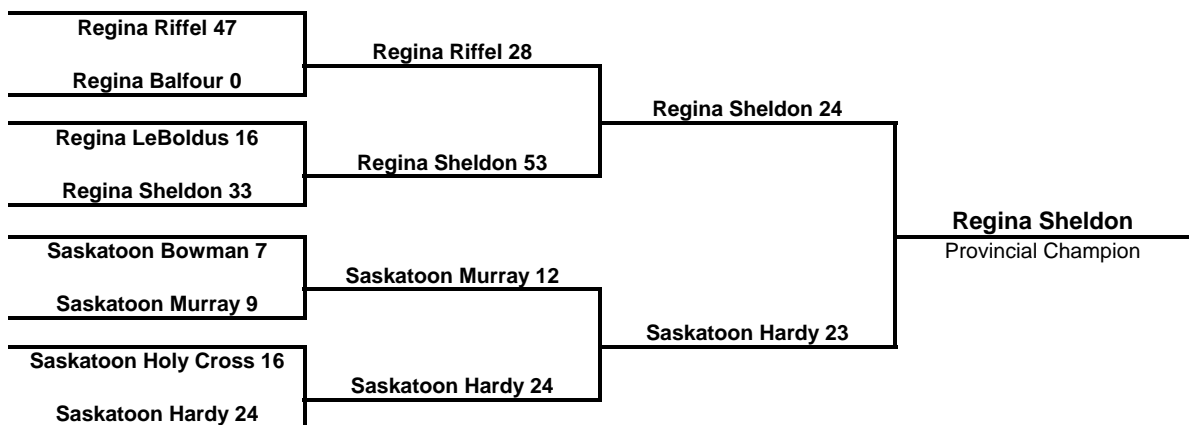
9-Man Provincial Football Playoffs

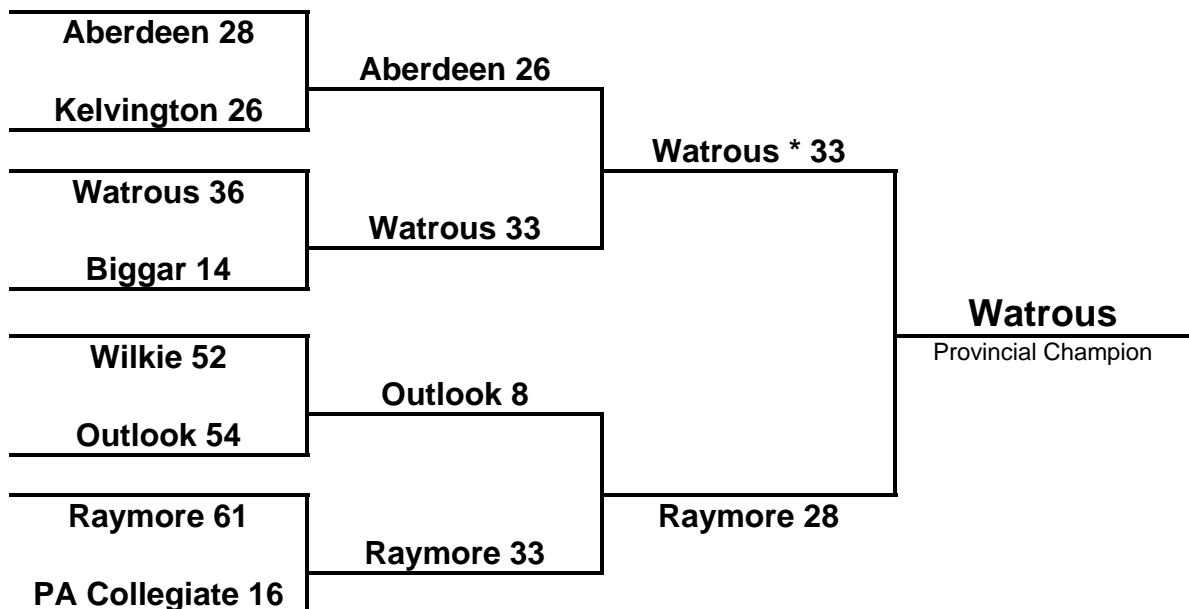
