Executive Director's Report

Welcome back to what may prove to be a very interesting year for interschool athletics. This school year will see more organizational change and there will be adjustments as the year evolves. This will be the first year that school sport is organized on the provincial level according to the new school divisions and new SHSAA District organizations. The plan approved by the AGM in June, to conduct activities classified by school population using the conference model will require a change in thinking and more planning by all involved to ensure a successful playoff experience for our student athletes. As much detail as possible has been included in this newsletter. It is important to realize that the plans listed in the newsletter are based on teams / schools involved last year. Adjustments will be made throughout the month of September and plans finalized in early October for the fall activities.

The SHSAA annual meeting held June 21 – 23, 2006 in Estevan brought another great cross-section of educators and trustees together to formulate policy and plans for the future. One hundred and fifty-nine delegates registered for the meeting. SHSAA President, Wade Weseen from Lake Lenore School, chaired the three-day meeting. Five positions on the SHSAA Executive Council were open to election this year. Returning to the Executive Council for another two-year term are: **Wade Weseen**, Lake Lenore School, as President; **Larry Segall**, Prairie South SD, as Officials representative; **Jim Lissinna**, Kelvington High School, as Section III representative; New to the Executive Council will be **Roger Morgan** from Kincaid School elected to the position of Section I representative and **Donna Diekrager** from Regina Riffel High School was acclaimed as the Regina representative. Thank you was expressed to Executive Council members that are leaving their positions: Regina Rep, **Angela Tillier** from Luther College, and Officials Rep, **Marvin Renneberg** from Muenster School each of whom has completed the maximum term of four consecutive years on the Executive Council. A couple of changes from the SHSAA office for this year include a revised web site and a change in office staff. The web site will have a new look and feel but all of the functions will still be located on the site. An attempt has been made to make navigation to the required information easier. A new message board, on-line calendar and other improvements will greet you this fall. The most significant change will be the return of **Kim Platt** to the office following her one-year maternity leave. It is great to have Kim back at her post. We are also retaining **Jessica Blair** on our permanent staff. Jessica did an outstanding job of replacing Kim. It was evident that her talents are an asset to the Association and that the work load has increased in the office with the advent of regional and now conference playoffs to be managed by the provincial office. Kim will assume more responsibility in the day to day financial management of the Association, Jessica will be on the front line on the telephone and will assist in many management tasks associated with the activities. All four staff members look forward to serving schools and coaches throughout the year. Please call on us if we can be of assistance.

Listed below, in point form, is a summation of change items from the annual meeting that will be in place for the 2006-2007 school year.

- The province was divided into **fourteen districts** and four sections. **Section 1** – Regina, South West, South Central; **Section 2** – East Central, Qu'Appelle Valley, South East; **Section 3** – North Central, North East, Horizon Central, Saskatoon; **Section 4** – North West, Battle West, Central Valley, West Central.
- Teams involved in the classified activities will qualify for regional and provincial playoffs through **conferences**.
- **Blanket sanctions** will be in effect for schools that are within 150 km. of the Alberta or Manitoba border.
- The **eligibility deadline dates** for submission of eligibility forms have been altered.
- **Admission rates** have been increased for Adults (\$6.00) and Students (\$4.00) for all provincial championships. Conference and regional admission rates are \$5.00 for adults and \$3.00 for students.
- **Officials pay** scale has been increased for basketball and wrestling. Mileage allowance has been ratified to \$.30/km and per diems increased to \$10.00/meal.
- An **outstanding officials award** has been approved for each district.
- A **guiding principles** document was approved for the Association.
- The Executive was charged with investigating the use of a different shuttlecock in **badminton**.
- **Basketball** will now be divided into five classifications.
- Award ribbons for the top three Districts in each age category at **Cross-country** will no longer be presented at the provincial meet. The results will be posted on the SHSAA web site.
- Provincial **Curling** championship will return to the first weekend in March.
- Provincial **Golf** now requires the provincial host to assign an adult to facilitate each group during both days of competition.
- **Soccer** teams will qualify for regional and provincial playoffs through conferences. Provincial championships for the 1A and 2A category will consist of four teams; the 3A category will consist of eight teams.
- **Volleyball** will qualify twelve teams to provincials in the 1A to 4A category.
- Provincial **Volleyball** for the 1A to 4A Boys will be contested on the fourth weekend of November.
- **Wrestling** will use a crossover draw at provincials.
- **Wrestling** will use the CAWA rulebook as printed on December 1st and utilize a tie-breaking procedure that involves sudden-victory overtime.

Web Site

The information previously distributed to schools in the Bulletin is listed on the web site. This has proven faster than it can be printed and delivered to schools. The web site also allows for updates to be put up immediately and will be your communication link with regard to the activities of the Association. A brief newsletter like this one will be produced each September and January. The SHSAA web site, www.shsaa.ca, has been revised and will provide information quickly and be the most accurate source for up-to-date information, results and forms.

Sanctioned Tournaments

Complete, up-to-date listings of tournaments involving out-of-province teams or hosted by out-of-province schools that have been approved by the SHSAA are listed on the SHSAA Web Site. A reminder that the onus is on the teams attending the tournament to check that the tournament they attend is approved by the SHSAA. The onus is on the host school to apply for written sanction, if necessary. Tournaments conducted within the province, by a member school, with only participating teams from Saskatchewan schools do not require written sanction. The sanction is assumed when all participating schools are from Saskatchewan as all schools are members of the Association and expected to follow the rules as set forward by the SHSAA.

Tournament Listings

We have a new service regarding tournament sanction request. You can now apply for sanction of your tournament on-line. The form is located on-line as a selection in your schools ExNet member services area (same place as your eligibility forms). In addition, a school may wish to list their tournament in this area even if it does not require written sanction. It is a good way to let people know about your tournament. Give it a try. For now you can still apply for sanction using the form included in the handbook.

SHSAA Forms On-Line

All School Team Entry Forms (E3), Eligibility Forms (E5), School Enrolment Forms (E10) and the Officials Registry (E15) must be submitted on-line. Your cooperation is much appreciated and the office staff is available by telephone to assist at any time. **Remember all team fees are payable to the SHSAA office immediately following registration.** Deadline for School Team Entry (E3 Forms) and School Enrolment (E10 Forms) is September 30th. The bill shown in the yellow box on the web site screen for School Team Entry is your invoice. Invoices are not sent from the SHSAA office unless your school's payment is past due.

Each school Principal was issued a User I.D. and Password to access the SHSAA Forms (ExNet members login) section. Click on SHSAA Forms and login to file your schools forms this season. The Principal is responsible for access to this area of the web site and the I.D. and Password will serve as the Principals signature on forms.

Deadline Dates

Deadline dates for eligibility forms have been altered. The deadline dates have been moved ahead, some activities significantly. The dates are listed on the SHSAA calendar and in the SHSAA Handbook. Please avoid the late filing fee of \$50.00 per late form by filing your forms before the deadline date. The Association asks that all students that have tried out for the activity should be listed on the eligibility form. Also, remember there are a minimum number of athletes required for a complete eligibility form to be complete. One of the main reasons for altering the deadline dates was to ensure that the eligibility forms were completed prior to the first contest being played by the team. This has always been a suggestion by the Association and some districts have it set in policy. The advantage of filing prior to the first contest enables the principal/coach/athletic director to be informed immediately if there is a transfer issue that requires attention. In addition to this benefit, it also indicates to the school if there are any eligibility issues with the registered athletes. The classification of your teams is determined by the submission on the enrolment declaration. Please file your enrolment declaration on September 30th.

Coaches Symposium

The SHSAA Coaches Symposium kicked off the 2006 - 2007 school sport season. The Symposium was held in Saskatoon on the 21st & 22nd of August. One hundred and twenty-two delegates pre-registered for this multi-sport conference and we finished with one hundred and thirty-seven delegates registered. The Association would like to thank those coaches that took the time away from their holidays to attend. The Executive would also like to thank the presenters that shared their knowledge with our coaches. Thank you to the organizing committee and we look forward to next year's symposium program.

Guest Editorial

ARE ATHLETICS EDUCATIONAL?

What is the purpose of athletics? Is participation the objective? Or is it winning? The answer is-- both! You always try to win. But the more students participating at the level best suited for them the better the program.

Variety in the form of free play, recreational activities, physical education, intramurals, club sports, and school sport is essential to accommodate the activity needs of our students. And remember, comradeship, personal enjoyment, achievement, satisfaction, and fitness are just as worthwhile goals as winning.

Remember too, that education is learning and it matters little whether the learning takes place in a formal classroom or in a more casual setting and circumstance.

Webster defines education as the "Discipline of mind and character through study or instruction". The following words are boldfaced: learning, training, discipline. These words are commonplace in the sports teacher's nomenclature. They help define education and form the foundation that most instructors build upon.

Since all experience is part of a person's education, it is not difficult to assume that a well-organized, carefully planned sport experience will also be educational. Granted, the degree of benefit will vary with the input and the response of the individual. But this is just as true in the classroom and other learning areas.

Indeed, there are lessons in every practice, every contest, every win and every defeat. The individual must interpret their impact and importance.

The preparation for each contest requires:

- 1. The total discipline of mind, body, and character.**
- 2. Skill learning and quick response.**
- 3. The anticipation of public judgment and the subsequent appraisal of one's personal effort.**
- 4. The ability to accept defeat with grace and understanding, yet to be ready for the next challenge. To enjoy victory with humility.**
- 5. Working, worrying, and studying to achieve a goal--- winning a starting position or the contest; gaining the respect of your peers; going further than you thought possible in your quest.**

Through sport participation, many men and women have learned to rise to the occasion and to form close comradeship with teammates, coaches, and even opponents. These associations usually contribute to the educational process during the participant's formative years.

At this stage of his/her life, the young athlete is usually in a critical stage of development with respect to his personality, character, philosophy, and moral attitudes, and the sports teacher is in the right place at the right time to exert a positive influence.

Sport offers invaluable opportunities for the development of self-discipline -- for the athlete to test himself/herself. Under game duress, the athletes must exercise his discipline in a variety of ways:

- 1. By following instructions, including the team plan.**
- 2. By exhibiting patience while waiting for his skill and intelligence to start working for him/her.**
- 3. By showing good judgment.**
- 4. By staying in the team pattern.**
- 5. By never losing his self-control.**
- 6. By putting integrity above winning.**

Though sport is only part of the student's total education, it can be extremely meaningful. It can contribute much that is worthwhile in the educational process.

The student spectator can, to a lesser, but not insignificant degree, also benefit from such experience. The spectator can learn to share in victory and defeat, to exercise restraint, to give vent to wholesome emotion, and to develop a compassion for others in pressure or difficult situations.

The extent to which athletics and all other formal and informal physical activity contribute to the individual's education is, as we have said, directly proportionate to what he puts into the activity and to what he is able to absorb from it. But the educational benefits are certainly there for the taking!

Finally, the person who dedicates himself to serving others is usually a productive, happy individual who enjoys functioning in meaningful fashion both for his own satisfaction and the benefit of others. That includes all teachers -- and certainly teachers of sports and recreation.

2006 PROVINCIAL GOLF CHAMPIONSHIPS

- 1. ENTRIES:** Provincial entry forms will be mailed to the District Commissioners. The qualifying scores submitted to the Provincial commissioners as well as the Provincial office are the scores that the qualifying golfers shot at their respective district competition, **not the golfers usual score or average score**. Entries to the Provincial tournament must be submitted **to the commissioner and the SHSAA office on or before September 18th**.
- 2. ELIGIBILITY:** Student athlete eligibility forms (**Form E-5**) for golf are due on, or before **September 13th**. Forms must be filled out and filed on-line via the SHSAA web site (www.shsaa.ca). Click on the SHSAA Forms button and enter the SHSAA ExNet – Members Login. Your school Principal will have the school's USER I.D. and PASSWORD.
- 3. COMPETITIONS:** Details regarding starting time and other information will be sent to your District Commissioner and posted on the SHSAA web site. Please refer to the activities section of the SHSAA Handbook for more details regarding the golf championships.
- 4. TEAM:** Schools may enter a team of up to six athletes with a maximum of four of either gender. The total of the four best scores on each hole will determine team scoring where at least one score must be that of either gender.
- 5. PLAYOFFS:** In the event of ties for second place a playoff will not be held. Individuals or teams will be awarded silver medals and no bronze medals would be awarded. In the event of ties for third place in the individual standings, no playoff will be held. All those individuals tied for third shall be presented with bronze medals.

PROVINCIAL PLAYOFFS

CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIPS:

Conference playoffs will take place on or before October 14th. Teams registered will be placed in one of four conferences. **The conferences have been listed below. This is according to last year's entries and is subject to change based on registration this year.** The make-up of the conferences will not be finalized until the September 30th enrolment declaration is complete. The SHSAA office will seed all conference, regional and provincial tournaments. It is imperative that all soccer teams complete and forward a seeding form to the SHSAA office by **October 6th**.

In the 1A and 2A category, the top two teams from the conference playoff advance to a regional playoff.

In the 3A category, each conference will determine their top two teams to advance directly to the provincial tournament (no regional tournament will be held). In the 3A category, the Regina and Saskatoon conference playoffs will consist of league playoffs. In the other two conferences, the playoffs will consist of a seeded tournament of the teams listed.

REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS:

Regional playoffs will take place on October 20th and 21st. The 1A and 2A regional playoffs will consist of four teams. The top two teams from the two regional playoffs will advance to the provincial final. **The host for the regional tournament will be the highest finishing team from the conference that is designated to host the regional.**

- **Seeding** of the conference, regional and provincial tournaments are important to the success of the championships. All teams **MUST** submit the results of their season to the **SHSAA office before October 27th**. Include results of all matches played up to that date.
- All provincial 1A – 4A tournaments will follow the twelve-team round robin – 2 pools – 2 courts draw on page 119 of the SHSAA handbook. The 5A provincial tournaments will follow a ten-team round robin – 2 pools – 2 courts draw on page 120 of the SHSAA handbook. Some modification of the draw times may be necessary to accommodate host plans. The SHSAA office must approve changes to the draw.
- **Accommodations** in some locations may be limited. If your championship is near a city with a Howard Johnson Motel or Comfort Inn, blocks of rooms have been set aside for the playoff. You may want to consider the Saskatoon Inn, Regina Inn and Quality Hotels.
- **Results for** Conference, Regional and Provincial events will be posted on the SHSAA web site (see SHSAA Results) as the events occur.

PROVINCIAL PLAYOFFS

CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIP

All teams registered for volleyball will be placed in one of four conferences; conferences will playoff to determine regional representatives. Conferences with eight or fewer teams will advance directly to a regional playoff with no conference playoff conducted. Conferences with nine to twelve teams will be divided into two conference tournaments with three teams advancing from each conference tournament to the regional tournament. Conferences with more than twelve teams will be divided into three conference tournaments with two teams from each conference tournament advancing to the regional playoff.

A tentative listing of the volleyball conferences is listed in this document. The conferences will be revised following the September 13th eligibility due date and finalized following the enrolment declaration date of September 30th.

Conference playoffs may consist of the following draws: a four or five team conference tournament will consist of a full round-robin tournament with no playoff round. The 6-team conference tournament will consist of two pools of 3, with all teams advancing to the playoff round. All played as one-day events. A seven or eight team conference tournament will consist of two pools, with the top 3 teams in each pool advancing to the playoff round; played as a 1.5 day event. Details for the various draws will be listed on the SHSAA web site.

In the 1A to 4A classifications, Conference playoff for girls will be held on or before November 4. Conference playoffs for boys will be held on or before Nov. 10. In the 5A classification no conference playoffs will be held all teams will advance to either the city league playoff or the regional tournament to determine the provincial representatives.
